Only We Can Save The World

<p>Reading</p> <p>In reading, we will be working on reading fluency. Learning how to read a passage in a clear way that helps our understanding. We will look at vocabulary that is unfamiliar with us and explore the meaning of it.</p>	<p>Writing</p> <p>In English, we will start by reading the book 'The Wonder Garden'. This book explores different habitats. We will work towards writing our own journey through a habitat in the style of the book. We will then write a letter to persuade others to protect our chosen habitat.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>This half term we will continue to work in our Maths revision groups as we prepare to sit our SAT tests. Each group will have a slightly different focus as each Maths group teacher will have analysed the practise papers that you sat before the half term holiday and identified areas of the Maths curriculum to focus on.</p>
<p>Geography</p> <p>In geography we will be looking at natural resources available on Earth. We will learn where they are located. Understand how they are traded around the world. Explore how human actions are impacting the planet and the effect of climate change.</p>	<p>PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education)</p> <p>Our topic is 'Happy, Healthy, Me'. We will explore how to overcome problems and challenges on the way to achieving goals. We will give examples of an emotional risk and a physical risk.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>We will be exploring modern music and understanding the different cultural meanings of them. We will learn how to read notes and how many beats represent them. Finally, we will select sounds and structures to convey an idea.</p>
<p>French</p> <p>Our French topic is 'School'. We will learn the name for different school subjects which we will then learn how to give an opinion on. We will apply our knowledge of numbers to learn how to tell the time.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>In RE, we will be exploring the concept of 'Freedom' and representing what this concept means to us. Following this, we will explore the exodus story and the Jewish festival of Passover.</p>	<p>DT</p> <p>In DT we will be looking at the seasonality of food. We will consider the impact of our food choices on the planet. We will then design and make our own nutritional, seasonal meal.</p>
<p>Games and PE</p> <p>In games, we will be playing netball. We will be practicing passing skills, defending and shooting. In dance, we will focus on developing an idea or theme into dance choreography.</p>
