Year 5—Spring 2 Topic Overview



This half term, our topic is titled: USA Road Trip! We will learn about the Geography of the North America, looking at how it is separated into states. We will learn about the variety of genres of music enjoyed throughout the USA and gather data about the country to compare to the UK using different computer programmes.

USA Road Trip!

Reading We will be reading a text called "Moondial by Helen Cresswell " in our read aloud sessions. As well as exploring non-fiction texts linked to North America in our reading sessions focusing on vocabulary and retrieval VIPERS.	Writing In English, we will be writing a non- chronological report about the yellow spotted lizard in "Holes" applying our grammar skills of paragraph cohesion and ambitious vocabulary to create a sense of warning and danger.	Maths We will firstly finish our unit on fractions - finding fractions of amounts- before moving on to decimals and percentages. We will then apply our formal methods of the four operations in a unit on perimeter and area.
Science We will firstly finish our unit on reversible and irreversible changes by conducting experiments into rusting. We will then move on to the topic "forces" looking at air and water resistance.	PSHE (Personal, Social, Heath Education) In our unit "Healthy, Happy Me", we will be learning ways to show responsibility and identifying our own strengths and talents as well as areas to work on.	Music In music lessons we will be going on a virtual road trip across America and will be visiting different cities and states and exploring them and the music associated with these different destinations.
French We will be learning phrases around "What is the Weather?" describing the weather and also presenting a weather forecaster pretending to be on television.	Geography During Geography lessons, the children will learn about how the USA is separated into states and some differences between these states. Children will discover more about settlements and national parks in the USA and will compare these with those in the UK.	Computing We will be learning about data information flat-file databases and how they can be used to organise data in records. We will create graphs and charts from our data to compare and contrast.
Games and PE In PE we will be learning skills related to golf including aiming at a target from different distances. In Games we will be practising strategies and tactical skills linked to tennis.

In this unit, we will consider the concept of suffering and discuss and explain the suffering experienced by Jesus in the Easter story. We will respond to this concept and explain our own responses to suffering.
