This half term, our topic is titled: It Rocks! In this topic, we will be learning about the Stone Age through to the Iron Age and using this to support our creative ideas in our English writing. In addition to this, we will be developing our sketching skills in art and learning about rocks and soils in science.

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It Rocks!		
Reading In Reading lessons, we are reading, 'The Stolen Spear' where we learn about Wolf and his adventures to find the stolen spear. Additionally, we will be looking at non-fiction texts about the Stone Age. This half term, we will be focussing on prediction, retrieval, and inference skills.	Writing In English lessons, we are reading, 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth.' In our writing, we will be writing a set of instructions on how to wash/feed/look after a sabre toothed tiger. In addition to this, we will be using 'The Stolen Spear' to retell the story of when Wolf meets Crow from Crow's point of view.	Maths This half term we will continue to develop our addition and subtraction skills using formal written methods alongside pictures and concrete resources. We will also be looking at multiplication and division using equal groups, arrays, sharing and grouping. Alongside this, we will be consolidating our 2, 3, 4 and 8 times tables.
History This half term, we will be learning about changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including daily life, settlements, farming, tools and weapons, clothing and trade. We will also be developing our understanding of when this time period was and how long it lasted.	PSHE (Personal, Social, Heath Education) This half term the theme is 'Rights and Responsibilities' This will involve, looking at key people whose responsibilities are to keep us safe and healthy and recognising the difference between fact and opinion.	Science In Science, we will be learning about rocks. We will be comparing their appearances and features as well as recognising how fossils are formed.
Art In Art, we will be developing our drawing skills, learning how to create different effects and textures using pencil and charcoal. We will be creating observational drawings of Stone Age Creatures.	Games and PE In our PE lessons, we will be following a series of Yoga lessons to develop our core strength, control, balance and mindfulness. In Games lessons, we will be exploring Basketball skills and team games.	RE (Religious Education) Our concept in RE is waiting; we will be thinking about how Christians use the time of waiting during Advent and have a go at making our own Advent wreaths.
French Our focus in French this half term is animals. We will learn the French names of 10 different animals and the correct determiner to use for each.	Music In Music, we will be listening and responding to a range of music, learning what is meant by texture, diction, melody, drone and ostinato, before composing our own piece of music with tuned and untuned instruments.
